Christmas to mean?

But here is what we say we believe: Salvation is found in no one else for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved (Acts 4:12). Also in John 14:6: I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. Because of what Jesus taught He was crucified! Through the years many Christians have been executed because they refused to renounce what He said. I have been told that more people were martyred for their faith in Jesus during the last century than in all the previous years since Jesus was crucified.

Jesus' words are sometimes ignored or criticized. But we should not remain silent about our faith in who He is! If we say Jesus is our Savior that means we depend on Him to give us eternal life. Jesus should be at the very front of our hearts and tongues. We are the ones God has chosen to tell the whole world who His Son is.

Let's do our best this Christmas season to honor Jesus, as God wants Him to be honored! We do not need to argue with others. Sometimes our silent loving behavior can speak louder than words. We are gloriously saved children of God who believe that He is the reason we have great joy!

CHRASTMAS

One night long ago, near the little town of Bethlehem, shepherds were in the field, watching over their sheep.

There is no indication that this night was any different from other nights. Perhaps they had a small fire and were sitting around it. Some might have been dozing, while others were alert, listening for sounds from the sheep that might mean trouble.

Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared. With the sound of his voice and the glory shining all around, they were instantly wide-awake. Their immediate reaction was fear, but the angel's first words were, *Be not afraid*. God had good news for them! The angel told them of the Savior's birth in nearby Bethlehem. Then he told them how to find the Lord. He would be wrapped in the clothes that babies wore at that time, lying in a manger (where cattle fed). But the angel didn't tell them which manger would cradle the Christ Child, or even behind which inn it would be found.

Can you imagine how many mangers there might have been in Bethlehem at that time? The town was so crowded that there had been no room for Mary and Joseph at the inn. People in that day traveled on donkeys and camels so there also would have been little room to shelter their animals. The Lord was to be found only by those who persevered in seeking Him. The shepherds had to search in many places for Jesus before they found where He lay.

The Christian life also requires perseverance. The "race" that Paul talks about in Hebrews 12 is a marathon race, not a 50-yard dash. It requires patience and endurance.

Did you know that Romans 5:3 tells us that our troubles can produce perseverance in us? That certainly is *not* one of my favorite verses! I would much rather receive the answers to my prayers quickly and easily. However, that's not the way God usually deals with us. Hebrews 10:36 tells us that we need to persevere to receive God's promises.

The shepherds felt great joy when they found the Lord. They praised and glorified God. What a blessing to be chosen to be the very first people to see God's Anointed One. And just think! They might have missed that special blessing if they had not persevered in searching for Him. Jeremiah 29:13 tells us that the Lord is found when we search for Him with all our heart.

Do you need help from the Lord? For physical healing? Finances or broken relationships? In coping with grief or insecurity, emotional pain? God does not hide Himself from us, but He is found when we seek Him with all our heart.

All too often we feel we should be able to pull up to God's "drive-in window", and receive a full order of health, prosperity and answers to our prayers. It is true that all our needs are met in Christ Jesus. It is also true that He may want us to learn something, along the way, to mature in a particular area. Real life requires perseverance.

Let's make a decision to learn to persevere. Not only will this honor the Lord, but it will be a blessing to us. Can you think of a more blessed gift than to someday hear Jesus say: *You have persevered and endured* (Rev. 2:3). This season let's give Jesus the Christmas present of seeking Him with all our heart.






